### **Learning outcomes**

Seminar participants will broaden and deepen their knowledge of development economics with a special focus on issues relevant for countries in Sub-Saharan Africa. By writing a seminar paper on a specific topic and country, they will deepen and broaden their knowledge and methodological skills in the area of development economics.

#### Content

The main goal of the seminar is to analyse economic issues relevant to countries in sub-Saharan Africa. Building on the theories and policy issues covered in the module "African Economic Development", students will use advanced analytical tools to examine specific topics in selected African countries.

## **Teaching methods**

Seminar (writing of seminar paper, presentations and discussions)

#### Mode of assessment

The module examination consists of a written seminar paper and the presentation of the paper (max. 50 points each). The module score is then calculated on a point scale from zero to 100 points. Students can achieve bonus points for active class participation.

# Requirement for the award of credit points

Credit points are awarded after successfully passing the module examination (written seminar paper and presentation). Students must achieve at least 50% of the attainable points to obtain credit points for the module.
