Learning outcomes

After participation, the students should be able to understand the most important theoretical models in the economics of migration and know the empirical literature. The module aims to give students the necessary skills to read and understand the scientific literature in this area and be able to critically assess empirical studies and policy measures.

Content

Can immigration help solving the problems connected to demographic change, how do political decisions such as the EU-enlargement affect the composition of migrants and does the economic and social integration of "economic" migrants differ from those of refugee migrants? This module aims to introduce the students to the economics of migration. In a basic lecture, the students are introduced to the basic theoretical and empirical concepts of the three main topics of the economics of migration: i.) the migration decision; ii.) the economic and social integration of migrants; and iii.) the economic effect of migration on natives. Afterwards, the students will be assigned to present major publications on the economics of migration in order to deepen the knowledge obtained through the lecture.
